Purpose

In 2014, the Tennessee Department of Agriculture revised the educational requirements for producers interested in participating in the Tennessee Agriculture Enhancement program (TAEP) with the previously offered Tennessee Quality Milk Initiative becoming the Tennessee Master Dairy Producer program. The new program will address a wide range of dairy-related topics related to the overall productivity and profitability of a farm. The first educational program offered as part of Master Dairy Producer will focus on new approaches to calf and heifer management. Subsequent programs in 2014 will focus first on heat stress and transition cow management and then later on options for reproduction programs. Specific details of these programs will be released at a later date. Farmers interested in applying for the 50% cost share through the TAEP program will need to attend 2 of the 3 programs offered during 2014.
